

CLIQUET NOTE on SMI® (Swiss Market Index) with a reference bond Deutsche Bank Minimum Coupon (Floor) of 0.50% p.a.

PRODUCT DESCRIPTION

Cliquet Notes with a reference bond (hereinafter also referred to as structured products with a reference bond) additionally refer to a reference bond compared to traditional Cliquet Notes, in that certain events in respect of the reference bond (default or redemption event) may have a negative impact on the value and result in an early redemption (see "Early redemption or determination of a default or redemption event"). Provided that no default or redemption event occurs in respect of the reference bond, the function of this product corresponds to that of a traditional Cliquet Notes, as specified below:

Cliquet Notes are characterized by capital protection at maturity and regular coupon payments. The coupon payments are calculated on the annual coupon fixing dates, based on the sum of the monthly performances of the underlying (performance component) and the minimum between 0 and the previous year performance component. In this respect, each monthly performance has a cap. If the coupon calculated in this way is below the annual minimum coupon, then the annual minimum coupon is paid out. This coupon calculation takes place annually.

In Switzerland, these financial instruments are considered structured products. They are not collective investment schemes within the meaning of the Swiss Federal Act on Collective Investment Schemes (CISA), and are therefore not subject to the regulations of the CISA or the supervision of the Swiss Financial Market Supervisory Authority FINMA.

For private investors domiciled in Switzerland, the annual minimum coupons of 0.50% at their maturity and the income from the bond portion in the event of sale or repayment (modified differential taxation), are subject to the income tax.

Any payments or further coupon payments exceeding the minimum coupon represent tax-free capital gains.

PROSPECTS OF PROFIT AND LOSSES

Structured products based on a reference bond: Investors should be aware that the reference bond may have an adverse impact on the value of structured products with a reference bond, in that when a default or redemption event occurs in respect of the reference bond the structured products are redeemed early. The liquidation amount redeemed to the investor after determining or the occurrence of such a default or redemption event may be significantly lower than the issue price or, in extreme cases, even zero. This may also apply if a comparable structured product, but which has no dependence on a reference bond, has a significantly higher market value.

Under the conditions that no default or redemption event has occurred as regards the reference bond, the profit and loss outlook of Cliquet Notes with a reference bond is as follows:

Cliquet Notes give investors the opportunity to benefit from both capital protection and participation in the performance of an underlying through minimum annual coupon payments, whereby a monthly yield cap limits the coupon.

These products guarantee capital protection expressed in per cent at maturity: With non-100%-guaranteed products, the investor may receive less back than the issue price at maturity. During its lifetime the value of the Cliquet Note may fall below the protected capital amount. A minimum interest is guaranteed.

Even if the performance of the underlying is positive, the price of the product during the term can be considerably below the issue price. Potential investors should bear in mind that price changes to the underlying, as well as other influencing factors, may have a negative effect on the value of structured products.

Assumptions and limitations in preparing the market scenarios

The following market scenarios should afford the investor a simplified way of making an assessment of the significant factors that influence the investment performance of the certificate. Risks in connection with the reference bond

Structured products with a reference bond are very sophisticated and complex financial products, which require a special understanding of the product and the risk. Investors are strongly advised to obtain information on investing in structured products with a reference bond by seeking expert advice on the risks associated with the specific product.

The value of this investment and the repayment depends, amongst other things, predominantly on the reference bond and indirectly on the reference bond issuer.
